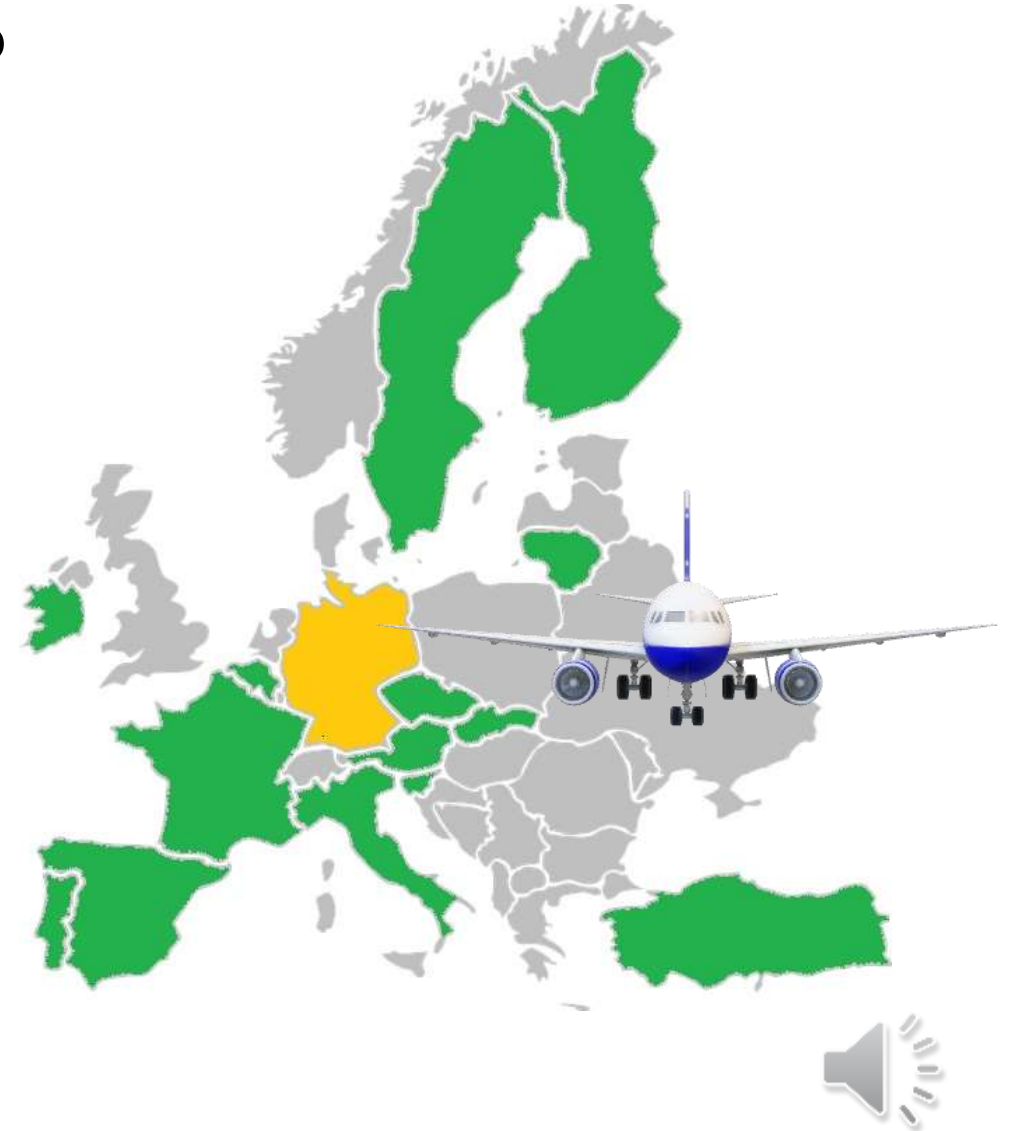
To render account: Where do we come from? What did I learn? Where do we go?

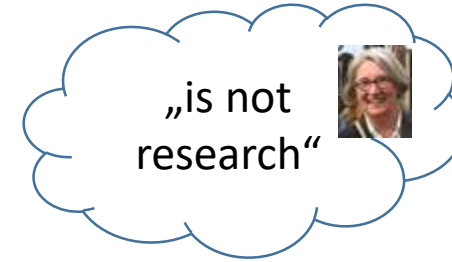

The purpose of ECPCP...



- that the paediatricians who work in the community and in primary care in many European countries will not be replaced by providers with less specific Training...
- that the accepted and proven components of child services in Europe will be preserved because simple replacement of primary care paediatricians will result in a deterioration of service quality and less satisfaction among families...
- everybody who is entrusted to care for children and adolescents must have adequate period of training and education of the highest

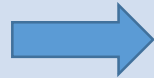
